



DIABETES TECHNOLOGY SOCIETY PUBLISHES THE MOST COMPREHENSIVE REPORT CHARACTERIZING THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN DIABETES AND COVID-19

January 22, 2021 – Burlingame, CA – Diabetes Technology Society (DTS) announced today the publication in Journal of Diabetes Science and Technology of a comprehensive report detailing the relationship between diabetes and COVID-19. The report is a summary of the Virtual International COVID-19 and Diabetes Summit, which took place on August 26-27, 2020 and featured 79 speakers from six continents, representing NIH, CDC, ADA, medical schools, universities, consulting groups, and manufacturers.

The summit highlighted areas of collaboration between experts in medicine, government, and industry to minimize the risks associated with diabetes and COVID-19 by applying effective clinical practice and emerging technology.
